LOCAL HISTORY

The earliest recorded mention of Hoxton is in the Domesday Book of 1086, where it appears as Hogesdon (meaning 'farm'). From open fields, the area. became a wealthy suburb of the City Of London, before becoming a dirty, noisy industrial district in the Victorian era. As industry declined after the Second World War, the area continued to adapt, attracting artists looking for cheap workshops in the 1980s. This artistic legacy can be found in Hoxton's many small galleries and rich tradition of street art (pictured).
