Festival Fever

The capital bursts into life this summer with a series of eclectic and innovative festivals that everyone will enjoy. From theatre and music to dance and art, **Jo Caird** joins in the celebrations.

ou might think that you know Greenwich, but until you've seen it lit up with the kind of events that we put on, you haven't seen it at all,' says Bradley Hemmings, artistic director of the Greenwich + Docklands International Festival (20-28 Jun; p. 50).

The free, 200-event programme opens with *Muaré*, by Argentinean company Voalá. Hemmings describes *Muaré* as 'a combination of skydiving, art and music' in the grounds of the National Maritime Museum. Other highlights include *Dancing City* (23-28 Jun), where international and UK dance companies perform in Canary Wharf, and *The Legend Of Hamba* (23-27 Jun) at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.

LIFT (The London International Theatre Festival; 2-29 Jun; p. 50) only comes around

every two years, but it's worth the wait. Among the innovative shows are The Roof (to 28 Jun), a 360° performance under the night sky witnessed by headphone-wearing audience members; Crackz (3-4 Jun), Brazilian hip-hop dance at Sadler's Wells; and

Red Forest (from 12 Jun), a play about the Chernobyl disaster at the Young Vic.




