An extremely minimal set allows Lee Harper and Matthew Simonelli's sumptuous costumes, all torn buttonholes, chiffon petticoats and sagging long johns, to shine.

Props are super-simplistic twodimensional cutouts that lend the production an air of children's playtime, echoing the naivety of

the central character.

A polished cast, no-nonsense staging and the considered inclusion of two unpretentious musical numbers make for a satisfying piece of theatre. W Until August 27
